- The UA Fayetteville campus signed onto a 5.1MW Solar Services Agreement in July 2022
- The UA System issued an Intent to Award to Scenic Hills Solar in December 2022

No upfront cost to the UA

Reduces risk from rising utility rates

Projected to save the UA \$3.1 million over 25 years

Cuts UA greenhouse gas emissions from purchased electricity by 8.8%

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The solar array will be developed off campus on approximately 25 acres within the U of A's electrical grid. The U of A will purchase the entire energy output of the array at a specified rate over the 25-year contract term. The facility has a minimum guaranteed production of 8,688,880 kWh in the first year which is approximately 6.3% of the campus electrical energy requirement.



This project cuts greenhouse gas emissions by **4,738 tons of CO**₂/year.

Campus Loop



The University of Arkansas campus sits just blocks from the Razorback Regional Greenway which serves as the backbone for a regional network of over one hundred miles of shared-use paved trails. Unfortunately, the connectivity between the Greenway and campus destinations lacks adequate infrastructure to serve all ages and abilities of users. The campus needs a contiguous loop of multi-use paved trail to envelope the campus core and allow for efficient circular flow, for transportation and recreation, for the community.

The new Maple Street is articulated through a series of spaces including a grand urban room at the campus gate, anchoring a landscaped pedestrian walk and cycle track. The central urban room extends Campus Walk across Maple to a new tree-lined edge.






